Sight Word Games and Activities Word Race

Materials needed:

- Timer
- Two baskets, bowls or containers, one labeled YES, one labeled NO
- Word graph (below)
- pencil or crayon
- sight words written on cards

Directions:

- 1. Place the baskets in the center.
- 2. Stack word cards face up.
- 3. Set timer for one minute.
- 4. Read as many words as you can in that minute. If the word is read correctly, place it in the YES basket, if it is not read correctly place it in the NO basket.
- 5. Continue until the timer stops.
- 6. Count the words in the YES and NO baskets and color the corresponding number of squares on the graph.
- 7. Repeat the activity and attempt to increase speed and accuracy.

Sight Word Games and Activities Word Walk

Create large cards with sight words printed on them. 8.5×11 paper works well for this.

Tape the words down on the ground. They can be in a line or in a pattern.

Have students walk, jump, and/or hop from word to word as they read them.

Sentence Scramble

Have an adult write a sentence using three or more of your sight words. (Not all words in the sentence need to be sight words that you are working on) in large print. Cut apart the sentence so each word is on a separate card. Shuffle the cards. Try to figure out how to put the sentence back in order as you read the words.

Variations:

- Read the sentence before cutting it apart.
- Do not preview the sentence at all by having an adult cut apart your cards to surprise you!
